


The Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, also known as the Way of Sorrows or the Via Crucis, refers to a series of images depicting Jesus on the day of his crucifixion. The stations grew out of imitations of Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem which is believed to be the actual path Jesus walked to Mount Calvary.

*In this service we will use contemporary images. People die on all sorts of crosses everyday. People are the caring hands and the hands that hurt. The Way of the Cross is all around us.* 

Mark 14:61-64

1. Jesus is condemned to death

But he was silent and did not answer. Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?" <sup>62</sup>Jesus said, "I am; and

'you will see the Son of Man

seated at the right hand of the Power,'

and 'coming with the clouds of heaven.'"


<sup>63</sup>Then the high priest tore his clothes and said, "Why do we still need witnesses? <sup>64</sup>You have heard his blasphemy! What is your decision?" All of them condemned him as deserving death.



2. Jesus carries	John 19:14-17
his cross	<ul> <li><sup>4</sup>Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, "Here is your King!" <sup>15</sup>They cried out, "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate asked them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but the emperor." <sup>16</sup>Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.</li> <li>So they took Jesus; <sup>17</sup>and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha.</li> </ul>
3. Jesus falls the first time	John 15:18-20
	<sup>18</sup> If the world hates you, be aware that it hated me before it hated you. <sup>19</sup> If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own. Because you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world — therefore the world hates you. <sup>20</sup> Remember the word that I said to you, 'Servants are not greater than their master.' If they persecuted me, they will persecute you; if they kept my word, they will keep yours also.
4. Jesus meets his mother	John 19:25-27
	<sup>25</sup> And that is what the soldiers did. Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. <sup>26</sup> When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." <sup>27</sup> Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

5. Simon the Cyrene helps Jesus to carry his cross 6. Veronica	<ul> <li>Mark 15: 20-22</li> <li><sup>20</sup>After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.</li> <li><sup>21</sup>They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus. <sup>22</sup>Then they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull).</li> <li>Matthew 25:37-40</li> </ul>	
wipes the face of Jesus	<sup>37</sup> Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup> And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' <sup>40</sup> And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'	
7. Jesus falls a second time	Isaiah 53:4-6 <sup>4</sup> Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. <sup>5</sup> But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. <sup>6</sup> All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.	
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem	<i>Luke</i> 23:27-28 <sup>7</sup> A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. <sup>28</sup> But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children.

9. Jesus falls a third time	Psalm 118:25-28         2 <sup>5</sup> Save us, we beseech you, O LORD!         O LORD, we beseech you, give us success!         2 <sup>6</sup> Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD.         We bless you from the house of the LORD.         2 <sup>7</sup> The LORD is God,         and he has given us light.         Bind the festal procession with branches,         up to the horns of the altar.         2 <sup>8</sup> You are my God, and I will give thanks to you;         you are my God, I will extol you.	
10. Jesus is stripped of his clothes	<i>Matthew</i> 27:34-35 <sup>4</sup> they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. <sup>35</sup> And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots;	
11. Jesus is crucified	<i>Luke 23:33-34</i> <sup>33</sup> When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. [[ <sup>34</sup> Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."]] And they cast lots to divide his clothing.


