Rev. Michelle Singh Born into an interfaith family, she has a deep understanding and appreciation for the world's rich spiritual and cultural diversity. She's been an Interfaith Minister since 2008 and has been actively engaged in Canada's interfaith movement, including vice-chairing the award winning World Interfaith Harmony Week Steering Committee and co-founding a multi-faith Spiritual Dialogue Circle.

Shaila Kibria Carter is a mother, loving wife, and daughter to one of the first Bangladeshi Immigrants to Canada. A community activist at heart, Shaila started as the VP Equity at the University of Toronto Student Union fighting for social justice issues, and now is the Interfaith Specialist of the largest Muslim relief organization in the country, Islamic Relief Canada.

Sid Ikeda has devoted his life to fostering unity. He has served three times as president of the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre (JCCC) before being appointed its Special Ambassador in 1999. He has received countless awards and recognitions.
