Rev. Michelle Singh Born into an interfaith family, she has a deep understanding and appreciation for the world's rich spiritual and cultural diversity. She's been an Interfaith Minister since 2008 and has been actively engaged in Canada's interfaith movement, including vicechairing the award winning World Interfaith Harmony Week Steering Committee and co-founding a multi-faith Spiritual Dialogue Circle which has been meeting monthly for 15 years. Michelle was also a Board member and Steering Committee Co-Chair for the 2018 Parliament of the World's Religions in Toronto. She sits on the Boards of Encounter World Religions and Greening Sacred Spaces Ottawa. She is currently Executive Director of Faith & the Common Good, a national interfaith network founded on the belief that our diverse faith congregations and spiritual communities can be powerful role models for the common good.

Yasmin Ratansi is an Ismaili Muslim who has been involved in interfaith dialogue and activities for over 30 years. She has worked with the Scarboro Mission to create a space for respectful dialogue between various faith communities. She has been a sought after speaker on topics such as Women in Islam, Islam and the Environment, the diversity within Islam, etc. She has spoken to church groups, synagogues, civil society groups, as well as at the public and private school systems. She is one of the founding members of the steering committee of the World Interfaith Harmony Week Toronto Steering Committee. She has presented a petition to the House of Commons to recognize February 1-7 as WIHW and also enlightened parliamentarians of this great initiative. She is by profession a Chartered Professional Accountant and a Management Consultant. She volunteers her time, to many worthy organizations.

Singers from the Sri Chinmoy Meditation Centre - a group from diverse cultural and religious backgrounds. Their spiritual teacher, Sri Chinmoy (1931-2007), dedicated his life to world peace through meditation, music, peace concerts, writings, lectures, Meditation at the UN, the global Oneness-Home Peace Run and in particular interfaith activities.

In partnership with Rogers Television, and York Regional Police, Earl was the producer of the 2014 York Regional Community Best Documentary Film, on the subject of domestic violence. He has served as the Church representative for the North American Interfaith Network (NAIN) since 1986. Earl also presented at the Parliament for World Religions in South Africa in 1999, representing the Church at the Parliament in Salt Lake City, Utah in 2015.
